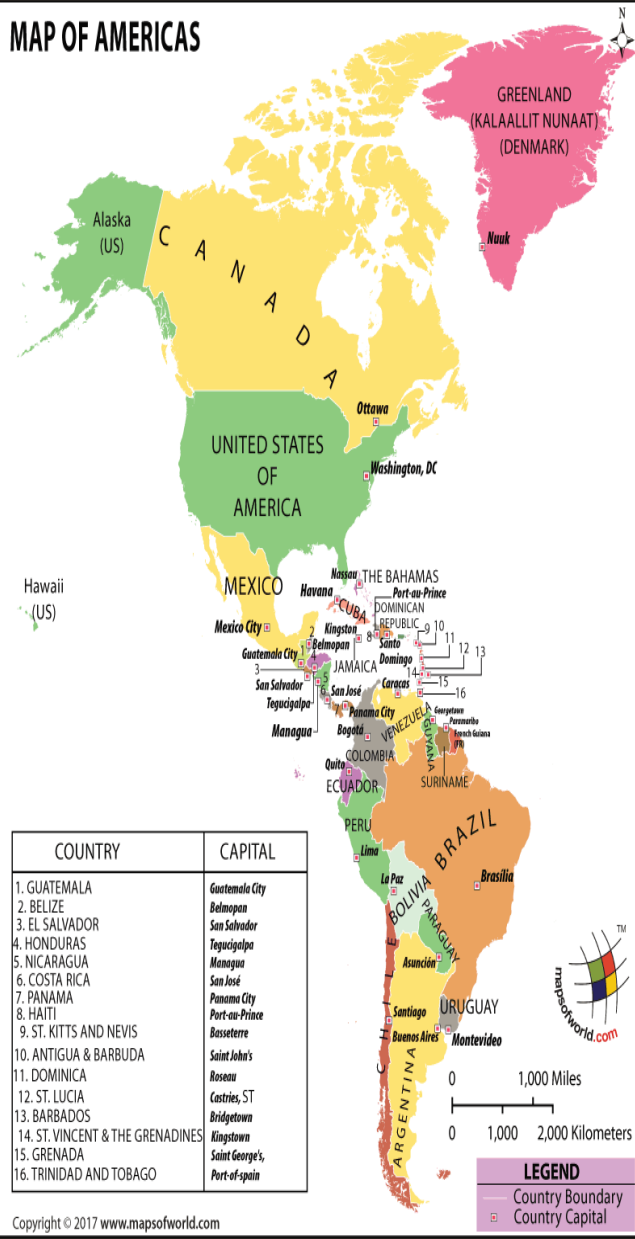


Vocabulary

1	continent	One of the Earth's seven major areas of land
2	grid reference	A number and letter telling you where a place is on a map.
3	latitude	The distance measured in angles of a place north or south of the equator.
4	longitude	The distance in angles of a place east or west of the Greenwich meridian.
5	climate	The weather conditions in an area in general or over a long time.
6	Greenwich meridian	The start point of longitude.
7	equator	A line drawn on the earth dividing the earth into northern and southern hemisphere.
8	urbanisation	When people move from the countryside to a city or town.
9	ruralisation	When people move from a city or town to the countryside.
10	human features	Things that are made by humans such as buildings and canals.
11	physical features	Things that aren't made by humans like rivers and mountains.
12	terrain	An area of land.
