



# Lowerplace Primary School

## Sports Premium Strategy Statement

### 2017 – 2018

This represents £1.3 billion in additional investment: £416 million more than was set aside at the last spending review for the core school budget in 2018-19, and £884 million more in 2019-20. It will mean that the total schools budget will increase by £2.6 billion between this year and 2019-20, and per pupil funding will now be maintained in real terms for the remaining two years of the Spending Review period to 2019-20. Funding will be allocated through a lump sum for each school and a per-pupil top-up mechanism. This funding is being allocated directly to Primary School Head Teachers who can choose how they use the funding to increase the provision for PE and School Sport. The funding is to be used for PE and School Sport (Incorporating Health and Active Lifestyle programmes).

Areas to be developed	
<b>A</b>	Staff to have CPD in the delivery of Sports to enable them to deliver it independently in PE lessons and clubs.
<b>B</b>	A range of sports clubs to be offered across the school day to overcome the current barrier to sport (Religious activities after school) and to provide the children with coaching, exercise and skills, which can be transferred into sporting competitions. To also introduce a new competitive approach to all sports clubs across school.
<b>C</b>	Specialist sports coach to introduce and deliver the new assessment format within school and to support all staff in their assessments
<b>D</b>	With an increase in funding a wider range of outdoor adventurous sports to be offered to the children, to reach and engage non-active children
<b>E</b>	To continue with the amount of sports teams provided in Key Stage 2 and to increase the amount of sports teams in Key Stage 1, to improve the consistency and to raise the profile of PE across the whole school.

B D E	The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – promoting healthy active lifestyles.	<p>Continuing to provide regular lunchtime provision, to the Key Stage 2 children, changing the registers every half term to provide all children with the opportunity to participate.</p> <p>Introducing five lunchtime clubs across the week for Key Stage 1, changing the registers every half term to provide all children with the opportunity to participate. A variety of sports will be chosen and they will be changed on a half termly basis.</p> <p>Increasing the amount of after school clubs, to allow for 2 clubs a night, utilising both the halls in school. Targeting a range of year groups and sports to match the competition programme.</p> <p>A change4life club will be offered to children to actively engage the non-participating children in being active.</p> <p>Due to the increase in funding, a range of outdoor adventurous sports will be introduced throughout school, allowing every year group the opportunity to experience a different activity.</p> <p>To improve the regular engagement of all pupils in Key Stage 1. A range of sports teams will be introduced to match the after school club / lunchtime programme, to allow the children the opportunity to progress their skills and engage/challenge in competitions. This format will be based upon the school joining the IPLCN network of schools.</p> <p>Dream Big Sports (outside agency) will deliver 1x PE lesson to all Year groups apart from Year 6 and Reception due to them having their own timetables. The events have covered over 5 sports with high levels of competition between over 10 primary schools across the borough.</p>



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A B C D E	The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement	<p>CPD opportunities for all staff members through RBSGP partnership and the Dream Big Sport partnerships. This will support staff in the standards of delivery in PE across the school.</p> <p>The PE principles and overview will be adapted to ensure consistency across the school, so that Key Stage 1 mirror the sports that Key Stage 2 are currently participating in. Allowing children to develop their skills in a sport specific environment.</p> <p>PE coordinators to look at the assessment format and change according to the new school format to provide consistency across school and to ensure progress is being documented.</p> <p>All staff members to be given a fleece and raincoat to match the staff and children's sports wear, so that PE and sport is recognised across the school. It also provides the opportunity for all members of staff to dress professionally when they support PE lessons, sports clubs and competitions.</p> <p>Joining the IPLCN and continuing with the RBSGP partnership, provides opportunities for a range of staff to support the children at various competitions. All competitions are to support the PE overview sports and sports clubs to raise the profile of PE throughout the school and the local community.</p> <p>Audits carried out throughout the year on sports equipment to maintain the high standards. Most children in school are achieving the end of year objectives.</p> <p>All equipment maintained and replaced on a rolling programme.</p> <p>Children who lack motor skills receive a quality specific intervention each week. This ensures we are teaching inclusive provision throughout school and the needs of the pupils are being met.</p> <p>All staff have been given a Lowerplace PE jacket in which they take to competitions to represent the school.</p>



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A C	Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport	<p>Through our new partnership with Dream Big Sports, all staff members will be offered a half termly CPD session on a sport of the staff's choice This will increase their confidence in teaching particular sports.</p> <p>Through the partnership with RBSGP, CPD events will be offered to staff members. Staff members will have the opportunity to partake in these to improve their skills in chosen sports.</p> <p>There will be a change in the assessments to match the new school formats. This will support teacher's judgements of children and also support their planning through the PE principles, which have been adapted to match the Key Stage 2 sports.</p> <p>After deliberation with staff members, the PE coordinators have bought into a whole school Imoves package to support the teaching of Dance and Gymnastics across the school. Staff members specifically asked for support in certain techniques in both of these areas. This will be bought on a 3 year package.</p> <p>Through the Dance partnership, we offer CPD to all teachers in Year 3, 4, 5 and 6, as they have to attend the lesson and teach with the Dance specialist.</p>	<p>Free, Dream Big Sports package.</p> <p>Free as part of the RBSGP</p> <p>Free</p> <p>£990</p> <p>£3000</p>	<p>All staff are now able to deliver high quality PE sessions, which has allowed the school to use Dream Big in different ways. This has meant the children are offered a wider range of activities, as staff can deliver the subjects content covered this year without Dram Big.</p> <p>Mr Leeming and Dream Big have delivered sports coaching staff meetings with the successful aim of giving the staff a range of games and ideas that they can use in their own sessions to improve the quality of PE being taught.</p> <p>All staff now teach their sessions using the new PE lesson structure. This includes a fun game/warm up, teaching the skill element and then applying the skill in a competitive game.</p>



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B D E	Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils	<p>Through the Dream Big Sports package we will have 6 after school clubs, which we target different year groups and sports. These sports will match the sports of the competition fixtures list, so there is progression for the children.</p> <p>To continue with the amount of lunchtime clubs in Key Stage 2 and to increase the amount of Key Stage 1 lunchtime clubs to provide continuous provision across the school.</p> <p>Introduce a range of outdoor adventurous sports to give children the opportunity to partake in unfamiliar sports that are not on the overview.</p> <p>Introducing a broader range of sports clubs in KS1. Mr Leeming has increased the sports clubs in KS1 so that both year 1 and year 2 have a sports dinnertime club once a week. These sports differ dependent on children taking part and enjoyment. 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B E	Increased participation in competitive sport	<p>After achieving the gold mark in the past two years, we have decided to further our partnership with RBSGP, to allow the children the opportunity to take part in a range of sports competitions.</p> <p>After another successful year of increasing after school clubs and lunchtime clubs, it has been decided that a structured competition format will be put in place, to further the development of the children in learning how to be competitive. This will match the new structure of PE lessons, which will also involve a competitive element in every lesson across the school.</p> <p>To increase participation in KS1 and allow consistency across the school, we are increasing the number of teams. This will give the children opportunity to take part in competitions through the IPLCN and RBSGP.</p> <p>We will continue to provide the same amount of sports teams in Key Stage 2, to give all children the chance to participate in competitive sport. This is going beyond one team per sport and we are looking to increase to more B and C teams across school.</p> <p>Sports day will continue the same format allowing all children the chance to win gold, silver and bronze stickers, along with certificates and medals across school.
