1	fleet	A group of ships.
2	armada	A naval fleet sent against England in 1588 by Philip II of Spain.
3	dynasty	A succession of people from the same family that have the same important role.
4	act of union	Act of parliament to bring countries together.
5	protestant	A member of one of the Christian churches that separated from the Roman Catholic Church in the 16 th century.
6	heir	A person legally entitled to the property or rank on that person's death.
7	catholic	A network of interwoven sticks and twigs covered with mud or clay.

Monarchy



- Henry VIII was famous for marrying six times and beheading two of his wives.
- Henry VIII's son, Edward VI, ruled after his father and then was followed by his wife Lady Jane Grey, who only ruled for 9 days.
- Queen Mary was later known as 'Bloody Mary' as she would burn people at the stake for not following the Catholic faith!
- Queen Elizabeth I never married as she did not want anyone to become king.

Separation from the Catholic Church

When Henry VIII became King, most people belonged to the Catholic Church, which was headed by the Pope. In 1534, Henry broke away from the Catholic Church and proclaimed himself head of the Church of England.

1485	Battle of Bosworth Henry VII becomes King after defeating Richard III.
1509	King Henry VIII becomes king.
1534	King Henry VIII separates the church of England from the Roman Catholic Church.
1536	Wales and England become a single state in the act of union.
1553	Queen Mary I becomes queen.
1558	Queen Elizabeth I becomes queen.
1588	Spanish armada defeated by the English Navy, commanded by Sir Francis Drake.
1603	Queen Elizabeth I dies; King James of Scotland becomes king. The end of the Tudor reign.
