#### Maths - Time

Quickly recap the features of a clock (hands & numbers)

Today you will be learning to tell the time to the nearest o'clock and half past.

Ask your adult to draw you a picture of a clock with some hands on it. Ask them to draw the hands on the clock to make a time e.g. 4 o'clock, half past 6. Can you guess the time they have made?

Top Tip: encourage your child to really think about the big hand being on 12 for o'clock and 6 for half past. As an extra challenge ask your child to draw the hands for a specific time e.g. 7 o'clock.

CHALLENGE TIME!

Your grown up will give you a time e.g. 11 o'clock (keep to o'clock and half past)

You will have to watch the clock to keep an eye on time - it goes by fast!

When it's the time on the clock you must SHOUT as loud as you can to your adult e.g. "IT'S 11 O'CLOCK!"

For every time you get right you can have 5 Dojo points when you get back to school.
